

WELLINGTON ISSUES POLL September 2024

- CLIENT:** Business Central/Wellington Chamber of Commerce
- POLL DATES:** Sunday 15 to Wednesday 25 September 2024. The median response was collected on Wednesday 18 September 2024.
- TARGET POPULATION:** Adults living in Wellington City.
- SAMPLE POPULATION:** Adults living in Wellington City who are contactable on a landline or mobile phone or via Internet panel.
- SAMPLE SIZE:** 1,099 respondents agreed to participate, 599 through phone dialing and 500 through an Internet panel.
- SAMPLE SELECTION:** A random selection of 10,000 Wellington phone numbers and a random selection from the Internet panel.
- WEIGHTING:** The results are weighted to reflect the overall adult Wellington population in terms of gender, age, and ward.
- SAMPLE ERROR:** Based on this sample of 1,099 respondents, the maximum sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/- 3.0%, at the 95% confidence level.

Wellington City Council has spent \$52 million dollars on cycleways in the past three years, an average of \$642 per household. It is planning to spend another \$56 million on cycleways over the next three years. Do you believe this level of spending is – too much, too little or about right?
